

In Primary Education we believe that children should be given the opportunity to explore the issue of diversity and understand Britain as a multi-cultural society. Providing a safe learning environment in which children can raise controversial questions and concerns without fear of reprimand or ridicule and explore boundaries of what's acceptable will engender an open attitude to multi - cultural and race issues. People should treat everyone with respect whatever their race, gender, sexual orientation, religious belief, special need or disability.

**PREVENT Guidance:**

The 2011 Prevent strategy has three specific strategic objectives:

1. Respond to the ideological challenge of terrorism and the threat we face from those who promote it;
  2. Prevent people from being drawn into terrorism and ensure that they are given appropriate advice and support; and
  3. Work with sectors and institutions where there are risks of radicalisation that we need to address.
- Prevent work depends on effective partnership. Coppull Parish demonstrates effective compliance with the duty, liaising where necessary with local Prevent co-ordinators, the police and local authorities, and co-ordination through existing multi-agency forums.
  - The school will work effectively with a range of services and partnerships. The school will ensure all risks are assessed. The school will inform the Local Safeguarding Children Board (LSCB) immediately in line with the normal safeguarding arrangements for all vulnerable pupils at risk of radicalisation as evidenced within the school.
